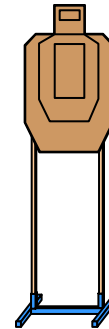




Fast Warm Up

Pistol Drill

- Bring **2 Mags** to the line, 1 mag to division capacity and 1 mag with 5 rounds. There will be 3 beeps in this stage. **15 rounds total for SSP and ESP** class firearms. **CDP Class firearms will shoot string 3 as 2 + 2**, total 14 rounds.
- From **Position 1** Load Magazine with 10 rounds and Make Ready
 1. On the beep, draw and fire 2 to the body and 1 to the head at T1, Holster a loaded weapon.
 2. On the beep, draw and fire 2 to the body and 1 to the head at T1, perform a Tac Reload* (or RWR) and fire 2 to the body and 1 to the head at T1, Holster a loaded weapon.
 3. On the beep, draw and fire 2 to the body and 1 to the head at T1, Emergency reload and fire 2 to the body and 1 to the head at T1
Unload and Show Clear
- ***Emergency reload** occurs when the firearm is empty and the pistol slide is locked open to the rear. When this occurs, the shooter drops the empty mag while retrieving another mag from the belt, inserts the new mag into the firearm and runs the slide forward by overhand racking the slide, or releasing the slide lock while re-acquiring a sight picture.
- ** **Tactical Reload** occurs when the magazine is not empty but the gun must be reloaded as called for in a Course of Fire. In this case the shooter removes a fresh mag from the belt pouch and brings it up to the gun while releasing the partial mag in the gun. The shooter retains the old mag using the 3rd and 4th fingers and inserts the new mag while remembering there is a round in the chamber and maintaining control on the muzzle. When the new mag has clicked in place, the shooter returns the partial mag to a pocket or belt while acquiring a new target OR holstering a loaded firearm. This is determined by the Course of Fire.
- *** **Reload with Retention** is similar to the Tactical Reload and used interchangeably in IDPA. The difference is the shooter removes the partial mag from the firearm, remembering there is a round in the chamber while storing the mag somewhere on the shooters pockets or belt. Then a full mag is retrieved from the shooters belt pouch and inserted into the firearm where the shooter then engages targets or holsters a loaded gun.
- **** **Revolvers and Tac Reloads** are run the same only the shooter retains a mixture of rounds and empty casings in a pocket usually because it takes too long to sort unfired rounds while on the clock.
